Univfy co-founder and CEO Mylene Yao says the company has developed a business-to-business machine-learning-platform that allows IVF clinics to accurately predict the chances of IVF success rate for individual couples. "Doctors mostly thought that age is the main determinant [for a woman's IVF success] and it's very important biologically, but it only contributes 50% of the prediction. If you're telling a woman her chances of IVF success are just based on age, you're missing half of the story."
